COMMUNITY RESOURCE ASSESSMENTS

Community Resource Mapping is a starting point to to understand the variety of services available to a specific child in the community to which s/he may return or be relocated

Resources that are appropriate/necessary for one child might not be appropriate/necessary for every child







DEVELOPMENT OF COMMUNITY RESOURCE ASSESSMENT

1) Phase One: Children in removal proceedings

Assessment tool for Unaccompanied minors in removal proceedings

Gather **community level data** to support immigration relief

Phase Two: Repatriation and Reintegration

Assessment and planning tool for children being returned to country of origin, or of parents' origin.

Gather community level data and document available providers

Phase Three: Children with domestic reintegration needs

Assessment and planning tool for children with reintegration needs

Gather family and community level data on resources to support children's reintegration



CHILD & COMMUNITY SERVICES ARE MULTIPURPOSE

Children Served include:

- US citizen or foreign-born children in the care of public child welfare systems
- · Immigrant children in removal proceedings
- Unaccompanied minors wishing to voluntarily reunify with family in their home country
- US citizen or foreign-born children separated from parents after deportation
- US citizen or foreign-born child victims of trafficking

Assessments support a variety of needs related to each individual child's permanency planning

- Information to support legal cases for adjustment of immigration status
- Development of a safe return and reintegration plan
- Service specific information to inform child-centered decisionmaking







CHILD SPECIFIC

Community Resource Assessments are specific to the individual needs of each child.

The referral should note:

- The context from which the child will be coming
- History of involvement with CPS
- History of abuse/abusers
- Identified caregivers
- Significant relationships
- Behavioral health issues and other therapeutic needs
- Medical conditions, medications, and other physical health needs
- Outline of other relevant history






COMMUNITY RESOURCE ASSESSMENTS

Community Resource Assessments provide a comprehensive, community specific report on the community a child has left, or to which s/he may be returned.

The assessments identify resources in a variety of categories including physical and mental health, educational and vocational needs, community, recreational and religious needs among others







COMMUNITY RESOURCE ASSESSMENTS

You will receive a checklist <u>and</u> a written report of all resources available to the child, as well as deficits and risks that may pose a threat to the child.

The assessment can become a tool to develop a service plan for children reintegrating with family members after a long separation.
